

- Also known as the Far Eastern leopard, it is the rarest subspecies of leopard in the world.

- Has a unique, widely spaced pattern of rosettes on its coat, distinguishing it from other leopards.
- Highly secretive and elusive, making it difficult to study in the wild.
- Primarily hunts deer, wild boar, and smaller prey.
- Only an estimated 84 individuals remain in the wild, confined to a small region in Russia and China.



2. Blue Whale (*Balaenoptera musculus*)

Facts:

- The largest animal on Earth, reaching lengths of up to 100 feet.
- Their tongues alone can weigh as much as an elephant.
- Feed primarily on krill, consuming up to 4 tons of these tiny crustaceans daily.

- Capable of producing the loudest sound of any animal, with calls that can be heard hundreds of miles away.
- Despite their immense size, blue whales are filter feeders and do not pose a threat to humans.



3. Sumatran Elephant (*Elephas maximus sumatrana*)

Facts:

- The smallest subspecies of elephant, with males averaging 7 feet tall.
- Have distinctive orange-brown hair and two prominent "fingernails" on the tip of their trunks.
- Highly intelligent and social animals, living in complex family groups.
- Their primary diet consists of leaves, fruits, and bark.
- Estimated to be only 2,400-2,800 individuals remaining in the wild, facing threats from habitat loss and poaching.




4. Black Rhinoceros (*Diceros bicornis*)

Facts:

- One of the most critically endangered large mammals on Earth.
- Has two large horns on its snout, which are made of keratin and can grow up to 5 feet long.

- Feeds primarily on leaves and branches, using its prehensile upper lip to grasp vegetation.
- Solitary animals, coming together only to mate or defend their territory.
- Poaching for their horns is a major threat, as they are valued in traditional medicine and as ornaments.




5. Giant Panda (*Ailuropoda melanoleuca*)

Facts:

- Belong to the Free Download Carnivora, despite their herbivorous diet, which primarily consists of bamboo.
- Have a distinctive black and white coloration, which aids in camouflage in their bamboo forest habitat.
- Solitary animals, except during mating season.

- Females typically give birth to one or two cubs after a gestation period of around 100 days.
- Habitat loss, fragmentation, and poaching are major threats to giant panda populations.




6. Mountain Gorilla (*Gorilla beringei beringei*)

Facts:

- The largest living primate, with males reaching weights of up to 400 pounds.
- Spend most of their time on the ground, foraging for vegetation, fruits, and insects.
- Live in complex social groups, led by a dominant silverback male.
- Highly intelligent and emotional animals, with strong family bonds.


- Habitat destruction, poaching, and disease are major threats to mountain gorilla populations.



7. Bengal Tiger (*Panthera tigris tigris*)

Facts:

- The largest subspecies of tiger, reaching weights of up to 660 pounds.
- Have distinctive orange and black stripes, which provide camouflage in their dense forest habitats.
- Apex predators, preying on a wide range of animals, including deer, wild boar, and buffalo.
- Solitary animals, except during mating season.
- Habitat loss, poaching, and human-tiger conflict are major threats to Bengal tiger populations.



8. Vaquita (Phocoena sinus)

Facts:


- The smallest living species of cetacean, averaging only 5 feet in length.
- Found exclusively in the Gulf of California, making it one of the most endangered marine mammals in the world.
- Have distinctive dark rings around their eyes and a curved mouth that gives them a "smiling" appearance.
- Feed primarily on small fish and squid.
- Bycatch in fishing nets is the primary threat to vaquita populations.



9. African Wild Dog (*Lycaon pictus*)

Facts:


- Also known as the painted dog, due to its unique patchwork coat of black, brown, and white.
- Highly social animals, living in packs of up to 40 individuals.
- Cooperative hunters, working together to take down prey.
- Their diet primarily consists of medium-sized mammals, such as impalas and wildebeests.
- Habitat loss, fragmentation, and disease are major threats to African wild dog populations.



10. Kakapo (*Strigops habroptilus*)


Facts:

- Also known as the owl parrot, it is a flightless bird endemic to New Zealand.
- Has a distinctive green plumage and a large, owl-like facial disc.
- Nocturnal and solitary, spending most of their time foraging for fruits, berries, and leaves.
- Their mating behavior is unique, with males performing elaborate displays to attract females.
- Habitat destruction, predation by introduced species, and disease are major threats to kakapo populations.


